Phrasal Verbs

We put a verb and a preposition together to make a phrasal verb. We use phrasal verbs to talk about actions. The meaning of a verb often changes when we use it with a different preposition.

e.g. **Tie up** the plastic bag, Tom.

Please don't leave any rubbish behind on the beach.
